

Eat in Detroit

While it's not possible to eat at all the eateries in downtown Detroit during your stay with Camp Restore Detroit, nor include all of them here, we chose our ten favorite places to eat in Detroit! A longer list can be found under "Attractions" at www.camprestore.org/detroit/!

1. If you want a real taste of Detroit, then you must try a **Coney**. What's a Coney? Essentially, it's a chili dog! Conneys consist of a hot dog with chili, onions, and mustard. Coming in at #1 on our list is a tie between **American Coney Island** and **Lafayette Coney Island** in the Downtown District. These two places have had a rivalry for about 75 years!
2. How about a sweet treat or some good bread? Well then, you need to try **Avalon International Breads** in Midtown. They also have some yummy sweet treats you can carry-out. If your sweet tooth goes beyond Avalon, then you need to try the **Astoria Pastry Shop** in Greektown, which specializes in sugary delights.
3. **Louie's Ham and Corned Beef** in the Eastern Market is a great place to get a sandwich for lunch or dinner!
4. For something completely different, try **The Potato Place** in the Wayne State District on the outskirts of Midtown. They use huge potatoes and load them with toppings of your choice such as bacon, chili, veggies, chicken, or even shrimp! The possibilities are endless! NOTE: This is a cash only establishment!
5. Looking for a great pizza? Never fear! **Supino Pizzeria** in the Eastern Market is known for using local, organic products. Want some deep-dish pizza? Visit **Pizza Papalis** in Greektown located right next door to the Astoria Pastry Shop!
6. How about a good burger? Try **Wahlburgers** in Greektown in Detroit, started by the Wahlberg family. Yes, the rapper turned actor, Mark, and former New Kid on the Block, Donnie, teamed up with brother Paul in 2011 to create this family venue.
7. In the mood for some Chinese cuisine? **Shangri-La** in Midtown is great for dine-in, carry out, Dim Sum, or even sushi. Shangri-La is a tasty meal before a performance at one of Detroit's local theatres, a sporting event, or one of Detroit's seasonal events.
8. Do you like barbecue? While Detroit has some great barbecue joints around town. Our favorite is **Slows Bar BQ** in Corktown. It has a gourmet spin on barbecue that has gained national attention. Since it is so popular, it can be difficult to get a table. That's why they also have a second location in Midtown called **Slows To Go**. They offer nearly the same menu, but there is no seating.
9. If steak is your game, then **Monroe Steakhouse** in Greektown while satisfy your cravings!
10. Tired of fast food "Mexican" food? **Mexican Village Restaurant** in Mexicantown is Detroit's oldest Mexican restaurant and a local favorite before a sports game or event downtown.
